The yellow rod is a yard stick (for you metric types - that's about 3 feet).



























































The Gibber:

I am withholding the measurements of the dog house because the size of my ice chest is going to differ from yours. Set up your fog chiller and measure around it. Tip: minimize the amount of cuts by going with the standard size plywood sheets. I don't own a truck and limited to the 2' x 4' smaller sheets. The front, rear, and two roof sheets have a length of 4' each.

I haphazardly followed DeathLord.net's Fog on The Rocks [FOTR] instructions for the above Fog Chiller. I am very glad to say that it will no longer take a 122 clicks to get to the instructions from the homepage but to speed things up I'll get you right to the FOTR instructions.

The above is styrofoam glued to the plywood - Styrofoam How To

The skull is Great Stuff with a latex skin - Skull How To

The Dog House covers the ice chest and stand. The fog machine sticks out a bit but not enough for my visitors to see it - plus - I do a nice job of covering my display with a good coat of darkness which helps tremendously to enhance my artistic representations.
