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## Spiderpod

A few people have asked me about this so here is a how-to on it.

### Materials:

- 1 milk jug
- Hot glue/spray-on adhesive
- cotton batting/fiberfill
- spider webbing
- twine/string
- 1 pumpkin light
- colored saran wrap
- small piece of dowel rod
- spiders



First I drilled a hole in the cap, then ran the twine through the hole and wrapped the end around a small piece of dowel, I then stapled and hot glued the end of the twine to the dowel.

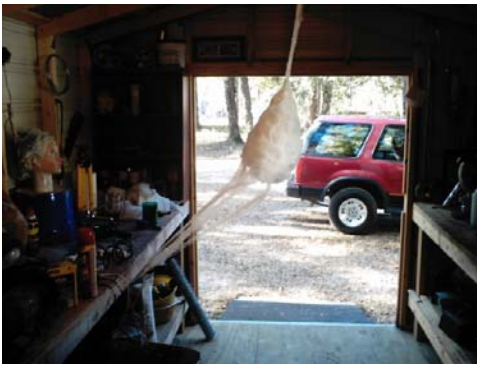
Next I cut almost all the way around the handle, leaving about 2" uncut below the handle.

I took the pumpkin light and wrapped it in blue plastic wrap.

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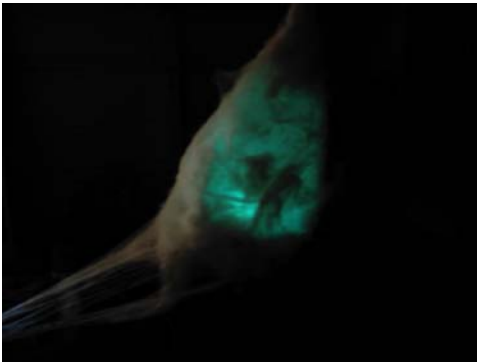


I put the light in the jug and hung this from a pipe in my shed/workshop. Next I took the cotton batting and began gluing it to the jug. I used spray and hot glue to do this until it was covered.

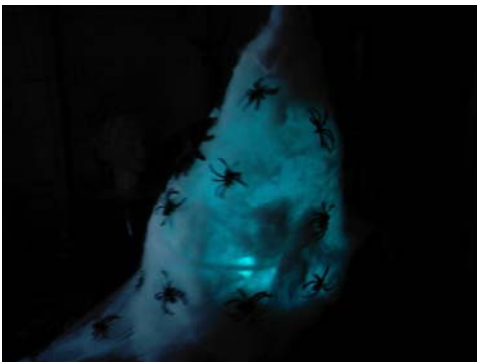


Ok, now I grabbed my heat gun and CAREFULLY melted some of the batting without burning it.

I did this so when i put the webbing on it would have some places to stick to. I cut some sections of webbing and began wrapping it around the pod. Then I stretched it up the string and let some hang down so I could attach it to ...whatever.

Now the only thing left to do is add spiders!

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Well that's all done. The light pulsates so I made a short video which you can see below. Hope you like it.

Q: How do you change the battery in the Pumpkin Light

A: Find the handle of the milk jug and pull it out enough to get your hand in the to get pumpkin light. I used less batting and webbing in that area to make it a bit easier. Just push it back in and move the webbing around a bit, should do the trick.

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
